

- Sovereign God (Job)
 - Mystery of God's Providence
 - "innocent" suffering sometimes happens for no obvious purpose
 - God will do the right thing
 - Suffering is sometimes for a revealed purpose of God
 - Philosophical arguments about the mystery of evil/suffering...

- The Cross (Matt 8:16,17)
 - Confirms how bad sin is
 - Illustrates suffering for a purpose
 - Puts our suffering in perspective
 - Shows sympathy
 - Model for our lives

- Sovereign God (Job)
- The Cross (Matt 8:16,17)
- The Future (Rev 21, 22)
 - This world not perfect or perfectable
 - The next world will be perfect... and so much better



God is sovereign but there is a mytery in how this operates that we cannot understand but one day all will be right

God's sovereignty demonstrated at the Cross

God is good but bad things happen because the world is broken

The Cross tells us God is good and restoring the broken world God is just Sin has consequences in life and death Justice demonstrated at the Cross
